Local Church Based Training

Purpose Built For Representing Christ In Community Spheres

Training has almost always been core to Christian ministry. Most of that training assumes a variety of roles within the institutional structures of churches. H.O.P.E. College is designed to equip & provide tools for people who see their major calling is to be a missionary in their current or future spheres of influence e.g., neighbourhood, workplace, community involvement, church, or ministry organization etc. All the training will presuppose students who want to see the community transformed and who want to be agents of that transformation. It is a 'vocational' training enterprise for advancing "Heaven On Planet Earth" (Matt. 6: 9-15; Jn. 1:14-17).

Focuses On The Process And The Outcomes

This training experience will attempt to be driven by the task of seeing the kingdom of God advance through community engagement, resulting in churches (Communities of H.O.P.E.) being established in community spheres. In that sense it will combine research, experimentation, field projects and partnerships with individuals and groups with the same heart and soul. We are seeking grace from heaven that will empower ordinary people to produce effective forms of 'common-unity' (church) in "their own back yards." The missionaries we want to equip will be trained for the cross-cultural ministry experience represented by the spheres where they live, work and play – in this country as much as in any other.

Mission And Vocation – Together

Unfortunately, we have allowed people to separate full time Christian ministry from everyday life. As a result, God's people generally associate their Christian identity with some kind of 'organized church' activity. We would like to influence the way people, young and old, see their primary ministry calling. It is the other end of the spectrum that assumed full time ministry as either a pastor or a missionary overseas.

We simply can't see why people shouldn't have the opportunity to pursue this kind of missionary training alongside their regular vocational training. We are working to produce training models that could provide course unit electives in a senior high school course as well as tertiary courses, other than those that are specifically related to traditional Christian ministry disciplines.

Practitioner Driven Praxis

Recognised Standards In A Context Of Mission

We are committed to enabling people to do the work required to equip them for service in a given missional context. That is primary for us. By the grace and extreme effort of our partners however, we have established a course that will align with and eventually satisfy government standards for the awarding of a (minimum) Certificate IV in Christian Ministry and Theology (H.O.P.E.)... Adding H.O.P.E. gives it our missionary training distinctive which we believe will be sought after in time because it doesn't identify with a denomination, it identifies with the Heaven On Planet Earth ideal and that is, God's Primary Purpose.

We will in no way sacrifice the primary objective in order to prioritize the accreditation, but we believe in providing training which makes it possible for students to articulate from one training opportunity to another with little or no penalty for their whole life approach to being equipped for the mission God calls them to – whatever that IS. The current paradigm of accredited training in Australia enables this.

The Training IS designed to give students the opportunity of achieving Certificate IV Level qualifications in as close to one year as is possible for them (Diploma 1 to 3 years), in a delivery style akin to distance education with the added benefits of face-to-face tutoring & mentoring.

Widely Recognised Equipping Practitioner Leadership

Graeme Hush is Principal of H.O.P.E. College, Senior Minister of the facilitating leadership team at Corrimal Community Church and Founder/CSO at Heartland Ministries Inc.

Graeme has been a “lifer” in the issue of firing up ordinary Aussies to become agents in the transformation of our community and its culture. With the call of God on his life, he has been instrumental in building options for equipping members of local churches for mission across this nation and abroad, having founded five local-church-based, kingdom collaborating, training institutes and their course unit libraries in three States/Territories; with a dozen or more of the course units he’s written over the years, accredited by the Australian Qualification Framework; the first of which was a forerunner to the current Community Services training package.

Graeme is a fellow worker in the cause of seeding the church in Australia to become more and more like Jesus and the way of the Cross and is guilty of an “incurable addiction” to the idea that we should equip followers of Jesus to represent and demonstrate the compassion and power of the Kingdom of God right where we are planted. On this issue, Graeme says....

“We need to trust Jesus to build HIS church. Imagine, people training for nationally recognized work qualifications in a way which enables them to apply their learning to explicit Christian Ministry contexts AND OR more general trade or other professional contexts as Father God divinely appoints or sends them. This is the season for equipping followers of Jesus with tools that can help them represent heaven anywhere and everywhere they find viable paid or voluntary work. This is our vision and a key focus of the H.O.P.E. College network charter, missionaries with specific community leadership qualifications across a variety of Australian workplaces and learning spaces.”

A Recognised Practitioner-Based Faculty

The H.O.P.E. College faculty of teachers, mentors and tutors will initially draw from our church's bi-vocationally experienced ministry team who are accomplished by the grace of God in a broad number of work and study disciplines. We will unleash the team from time to time alongside a growing number of ministry interns who will become tutors along the way because we operate in an 'equipping the equipper' mode.

We also have a growing kingdom - apostolic network. People who trust what God has placed within them and NOT in their own understanding. Experienced coaches and mentors like Jason Potter (CEO Australian Centre Community Leadership/Author); Brian Medway (Chair-Crosslink Christian Network International); Wayne Crockford (Retired University Studies Mentor/Author) and more local and regional partners, will make themselves available at various times and in various capacities to guide the equipping journey. We will fully introduce our developing faculty via our other communiques.

A Community Platform For Equipping

The Shape Of H.O.P.E College Equipping

To achieve AQF recognition for the Certificate IV and Diplomas in Christian Ministry and Theology (H.O.P.E.) by the end of 2023, the student will need to be deemed competent in 12 units of Competency. The actual hours of study will be determined in the context of the relationship that H.O.P.E. College establishes with EACH student and will be adjusted to fit the circumstances within which the student is functioning. The modes of learning will include but not be limited to:

- **Face-to-face learning and group tutoring**
- **Prescribed Reading and Disciplined Personal Study**
- **Supervised Praxis**
- **Occasional Intensive Modules**
- **Personal Mentoring / Coaching**
- **Cert IV Full-time in 1 Year; Part-time in up to 3 years**
- **Diploma/Advanced Diploma Full-time in 1-2 years; Part-time in up to 5-6 years**

Diploma level study will be considered for credit and some undergraduate training can also count towards H.O.P.E. College's vocational training.

Fee Schedule And Payment Options 2022

Important Note

Because this is a PILOT PROGRAM towards an accredited study option, ALL INITIAL MINISTRY INTERNS (i.e., students who apply for full time study towards the Cert IV or Diploma) will have their FULL course FEES covered, if they complete the award applied for by the end of 2023.

Full Time Study

This is the equivalent of 6-8hrs face-to-face per week plus another 6-8 hours self-paced and coordinated study.

NB: There may be other incidental course fees to cover costs only (like a once off Admin Fee of \$50 to cover copying etc.) ... OR a student may consider investing some money into this program as a genuine mission giving option. The College team appreciates any monetary gift as we would like to continue a 'scholarship' approach to encourage a greater uptake for ministry training.
